

RESPONDING TO CLIENT INQUIRIES FOR MAID: AN UPDATE ON CURRENT LAW AND PRACTICE

In June 2016, Canada legalized medical assistance in dying (MAID) with the passage of Bill C14. The legislation established MAID as a right for all eligible Canadians, while setting legal requirements around patient consent and participation in an assisted death. More recently, in March 2021 there are new laws and safeguards put into place which allows access to an assisted death for a broader client population. With these new safeguards and laws in place, we hope community service providers will take time to pause and reflect on their personal and professional values, as well as learn how to respond to client inquiries around MAiD. We would also like to share the steps in the MAiD process and how to access resources for clients who wish to begin this end of life journey.
