

Although hospital isolation is a medically necessary protective action for some patient populations, the way this practice is enacted by healthcare staff can have a profound effect on patient experiences, including the potential for traumatization and/or re-traumatization. In this presentation, results of a qualitative study are described that focus on an intensive treatment protocol in pediatric neuro-oncology.
